

New Beds for Hotel Dieu Shaver

Specialized beds & mattresses provide extra comfort to patients



etting restful sleep is an important part of health and recovery. It is especially vital for every patient at Hotel Dieu Shaver to have a comfortable mattress and safe bed during their stay.

This past year, thanks to generous community support, the Foundation purchased twenty-one (21) new patient beds for the nursing units, along with several specialized mattresses. The new beds can be lowered to support safe entry and exit, feature a siderail with maximum coverage and motion controls for both the patient and caregiver to make adjustments. The beds keep patients safe while reducing the chance of injury.

As HDS has been playing a vital role in the COVID-19 response in Niagara, Chief Nursing Officer Jennifer Hansen is thrilled to have the new beds and mattresses. "Along with providing rehabilitation services to patients from across Niagara, we have also received patients from local hospitals waiting for long-term care, and in February launched a post-acute COVID-19 rehabilitation program," says Hansen.

"The changing patient population at HDS has increased the number of patients requiring complex care and specialized needs and the new beds are crucial in providing a comfortable and safe place for them to recover."

Making an Impact at HDS

Rehab courtyard is named in recognition of Mountainview gift



In recognition of the generous \$750,000 gift made to Hotel Dieu Shaver Foundation by Mark Basciano and Mountainview Homes, the main therapy space in the Outpatient Building has been officially named the **Mountainview Courtyard**.

First announced in 2016, Basciano's goal was to highlight the patient-centred care and incredible staff that serve the residents of Niagara. During this time, funds from the Mountainview pledge were directed toward state-of-the-art patient care equipment and innovative rehabilitation programs. By early 2020, Basciano recognized how difficult the pandemic was hitting the community, and completed his pledge early to support the priority needs of the hospital.

A veteran of WWII, Chuck relished sharing his incredible stories, and imparting words of wisdom for the younger generations.

In celebration of Chuck's birthday and the official completion of his 100-lap challenge, a small victory parade took place in his housing complex, complete with marching band and balloons along the street. Neighbours and supporters came out on their lawns to congratulate Chuck and celebrate his achievement.

With the funds collected through Chuck's Challenge, several pieces of equipment have been purchased, including a new recumbent cross trainer, a patient lift and a ceiling lift for the neurology rehab program.

An Eye for Technology

AAC Clinic acquires new eye-gaze technology device & smart writing board

Thanks to a generous grant received from the David S. Howes Fund at the Niagara Community Foundation, Hotel Dieu Shaver now has new state-of-the-art assessment tools for clients of the Augmentative & Alternative Communication (AAC) Clinic.

Bob is a 74-year-old client who acquired a spinal cord injury after a surfing accident in 2011. He was referred to the AAC Clinic because he has no functional use of his hands in order to write. The clinic set him up with eyegaze using the recently-granted Tobii Dynavox I-16.



"This top-of-the line assistive technology allows Bob to use his eyes to control the mouse and type on an on-screen keyboard," says Nicole Johnson, Senior Occupational Therapist. "With this system, Bob is able to email, research on the internet, keep in touch with family and friends through FaceBook/Skype and write personal letters."

Bob says he is "ecstatic" with the service that the AAC clinic has provided. Thank you to the David S. Howes Fund at the Niagara Community Foundation for ensuring Hotel Dieu Shaver has the latest technology to serve our clients.
